Beginning of a new academic year remains a special event for the Rector of Tbilisi State Medical University Professor Zurab Vadachkoria:

Since 2012 TSMU runs the program that considers invitation of leading Professors of US, EU countries, Great Britain, Turkey, Israel, etc. Professors delivered thematic lectures in different fields of medicine and provided: consultations and charity operations at TSMU University clinics. Within the frames of the project more than 500 visits have been held.

Thanks to the contacts developed in 1998-2004 when I was a Vice-Rector for International Relations at Tbilisi State Medical University, we have been sending the TSMU students and young professionals abroad for training courses regularly. In recent years, these relationships have developed and now we have close collaboration with more than a hundred universities and clinics around the world. I have to express my special thankfulness to TSMU graduates working abroad - Dr. Irma Kvitsaridze, Dr. Giorgi Grigolia, Dr. Archil Undilashvili, and others who support our international relations. We offer the joint international programs in medicine, public health and management, nursing, developed in collaboration with our American, French and Austrian colleagues. We are proud that in 2002-2003, among the post-Soviet universities, the Tbilisi State Medical University was the first passed the external evaluation provided by the experts of European University Association (EUA). In 2009-2011, TSMU Professors: Rima Beriashvili, Gaiane Simonia, and I participated in the Working Group Meetings (MEDINE-2) of the International Association for Medical Education (AMEE). It is noteworthy to mention that among the non-the EU Universities only Professors of Tbilisi State Medical University and Ankara University participated in the Working Group Meetings. The fact that on May 23, 2019 a third AMEE International Networking Centre was opened in Georgia, based within Tbilisi State Medical University (TSMU) might be assigned to the great recognition and success. This is the success not only for the TSMU but the country as a whole: Georgia has become an international center for medical education that is an important step towards integration into the European educational area. This is a third center in the World. The main goal of the AMEE International Networking Center in Georgia is sharing modern methodologies in medical education and delivering professional trainings to academic and administrative staff, medical experts of higher education

- I was 16 years old when the most important thing happened in my life - I became a student of Tbilisi State Medical University (then Institute) that has completely determined my future life. 45 years have passed since then. Presently, I can clearly say that these 45 years have been the years of excitement, satisfaction, overcoming suspicion, constraints and bearing responsibility, the years of ending many projects as well as launching many processes of great importance for Tbilisi State Medical Uni-

I believe that these 45 years - long as life and short as one breath - are the years strictly connected with the sense of my life: my profession and job at Tbilisi State Medical University indeed, is the meaning of my life, that's what I

#### - Do you remember the first day as a medical student at the university?

Surely, I remember. Note that then the celebration of the New Academic Year wasn't as extensive as it is now. We try to organize such a fest, the freshmen students to remember it throughout their whole lives. Then it was as if the typical first day of the University, but a great feeling of celebration came upon us. The fact that I overcame the highest barrier and became a student of a higher educational institution, the best one for me, was the basis for high mood. That's how we all thought. I even remember the first lecture - "Advanced Mathematics"

#### Mr. Zurab, then a 16-year-old boy, was there any authority inspiring you embark on your career in medicine?

Yes, I had... I have never thought to become a doctor. I was in the 8th or 9th grade when my father needed maxillofacial surgery that was conducted by Prof. Mariam Grigalashvili. Since then Prof. Ğrigalashvili has become the great authority for me; and later my teacher as well; she was the Dean of the Faculty of Stomatology. As a person she was very moral and exemplary person. She even elaborated her own style of caring after students. She made a great contribution to the development of Tbilisi State Medical University. This is a happiness that she remains my first authority to this day!

#### Today, as a Rector of the Tbilisi State Medical University and a very successful surgeon, what can you say to the freshmen students, what was the main driving force behind the rise?

Apparently, the strong determination and the ability to overcome the obstacles play a big role in moving forward, and what about the driving force, I would say figuratively - to be a soldier of this university and ensure its further progress. It is a great honor and a great motivation as well. This is a hard task, very hard! The freshmen are aware of it as well. We used to distributing flyers at "Open Doors" Days and Exhibitions for several years, explaining the reasons "why one should not become a doctor" by TSMU Professor Kakha Chelidze. If that doesn't scare them off being the applicants and they are ready for lifelong learning and struggle, then our freshman students have made the right choice. Now all depends on them.

It is said that stress of working in the medical field, consequently, have you ever thought to reject a practical activity (if so, how did you overcome this cri-

Years' experience convinced me that

stress has always been accompamedical nying practice. In my vouth, stress was alike an uninvited visitor, however, over time I learned to live and deal with it. Today, I can say that the stress failed to make me reject a medical practice: it treated me shamelessly, made me fatigue, created difficulties but could not force me to abandon practical activities or change the way I think.

- I never thought about giving up medical practice, I can't imagine living without my profession or interacting with my little patients.

#### There are several professions requiring lifestyle changes; and profession of a doctor among them...

Yes, it really requires changing the lifestyle. The fact that today the students are given the mobility opportunities is of great importance. Let's say, you guessed that you didn't like it any more or it's not your profession and you can't change your lifestyle... You are given the chance to change the faculty, or university. If you stay, you should realize that you are not free, that your life is determined by your profession. When I was a teenager, I used to work on-call service for two clinics so, I did not belong to myself 10-15 days a month: either I was at home, or at the clinic, or on the road. There was no cellphone, you could not be engaged at will as you had to wait for the call anytime. Still - all the mentioned is worth to be a doctor. It is a great pleasure to feel a taste of sweet success, when you know you did well and everything will be fine ... I have the greatest respect for my profession. I am proud that doctors never gave up and never backed down in an array of extreme situations: during the 2008 war, the Georgian-Abkhaz conflict, Shida Kartli ... thev were doing the impossible and I am proud of my colleagues!

As for work in the academic field, it is an activity oriented on continuous growth and innovation, accompanied with complexities, but you feel a great joy and pride when you see the result. On the one hand, this is the result of the growth of professional staff, and on the other - the look and prestige of the university itself.

I am proud that unified national entrance exam barrier for Georgian citizens is unprecedentedly high - 70% at Tbilisi State Medical University not only among the other medical schools of Georgia, but any higher education institution of any profile. As for the US MD Programme – barrier in English language is making

It would not be an exaggeration to state that the best part of Georgian youth is studying at our University. We have set the barrier pretty high for several years now, so the society senses the high level of the graduates from the Tbilisi State Medical University.

According to the decision of the World Federation for Medical Education (WFME), from 2023, within the Euro-Atlantic space, will be recognized only a diploma issued by medical school, accredited by an agency, officially recognized by the WFME. On September 10, 2018, the Tbilisi State Medical University successfully passed the reauthorization process. Now we are eparing for taking impo accreditation. It is equally important that the continuous improvement of the material-technical base is onging process at TSMU.

The fact that the university has its own strong clinical bases (2 hospitals and 3 dental clinics) ensures providing a basis for high quality teaching. In addition to these bases, many depertments for clinical teaching are located in the different clinics. For example, in the 90s of the last century, Tbilisi State Medical University was oriented on the Western medicine (by the way, in 1996, TSMU was the first University launching English language-instructed program), but had limited opportunities and material-technical base. At that time we were trying to learn as much as we can, seeking assistance and support from different organizations.

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We are now at a stage of development, not only from representatives of medical universities in the Post-Soviet countries, but sometimes from the EU countries to share experiences.

At present, we are in a developmental phase, when, not only the medical Universities of Post-Soviet countries but sometimes, the ones from the EU countries are coming to learn from us and share xperiences.

Being a member of the Tbilisi State Medical University is a great honour and a responsibility, it is a heavy burden but at the same time extremely desirable and enjoyable one. What would you say to freshmen about this burden and the responsibilities related?

Once and for all I realized that to be a student and post-graduate student of TSMU, as well as an Assistant, Associate Professor, Professor, Head of Department, Dean, Vice-Rector and Rector was a great honor for me. This is the way I have done. As for me I don't think the loading along this way was a burden. Conversely, serving my university - the first and foremost center of medical education in Georgia - is desirable and enjoyable!

I hope the first semester students will experience the same sense when they feel like one of us, i.e. the University family member. For me Tbilisi State Medical University is a "sacrosanct value"... As I have often said: you can be angry and offended with anyone, from a lab worker to a rector, but you should never resent the University. It, as a sacramental matter, should be passed on to the generations, the generations should be raised and educated as a symbol of professional excellence and integrity. I would like to address the freshmen students: this is your university as of today! You are lucky as you have joined a very special and great family.

#### - Finally, what do you think is the key message for people who are tomorrow's doctors, dentists, pharmacists, public health specialists, rehabilitators and nurses?

 I know I am addressing to the best part of the youth of Georgia, having became students thanks to their talents and selfless work. I am addressing to the youth who chose the most difficult professions that requires a lot of hard work. When you see a tired, sleepy young man in European university towns, he, for the most part, is a medical student. Along with the hard work there comes a great sense of happiness caused by victory in the struggle for human life and recovery. Nothing compares to this joy and honor. Do become highly competent professionals! Make any effort to do so. Ask for yourself and others. Be demanding on yourseld and others. Do not be afraid of failures. Do not look for reason elsewhere, first you must look inside yourselves to find the cause. Respect your teachers, colleagues, learn and assimilate the principles of teamwork. Remember that prudence and moderation are always important in medical practice. Develop and refine your listening culture. Take the view of others into account, respect the differing opinion of one another but not at the expense of giving up your inner freedom. The path ahead is still quite long and arduous. You have a difficult way ahead, but big victories expect you! And the reward for your hard work is the unwavering happiness that comes with serving people, taking care of health saving their for your hard work is indescribable happiness that accompanies serving people, saving their health and lives. # **Department of International Relations**

The Department of International Relations is one of the significant structural units of Tbilisi State Medical University, the main goal of which is to support the internationalization process at the University via development of international relations aiming to deliver the best medical education on a global scale.

English-instructed medical educational programs, offered by Tbilisi State Medical University have more than 20 years of history. Nowadays, more than 2400 students from 71 countries worldwide (India, Sri Lanka, Turkey, EU countries, the US, Canada, Israel, Germany, Nigeria, Iraq, Australia, Central America, etc.) are studying at TSMU.

TSMU Faculty of Medicine offers medical education in English for international students since 1996; Faculty of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation – since 2008, Faculty of Pharmacy – Since 2013; since 2012 Russian-instructed programs for international students were launched at the Faculties of Medicine and Dentistry. From 2017 English Medium program was launched at the Faculty of Dentistry.

Since 2018 on the basis of the Faculty of Medicine the "International Faculty of Medicine" running the Russian and English medium programmes was established at the Tbilisi State Medical University.

In 2012, Joint International Bachelor's Program in "Public Health and Management" with UniMan Academy of Management and Performance (France) was introduced by the TSMU Faculty of

Public Health. Upon completion of the program a dual diploma - Georgian and French will be issued that gives the alumni more opportunities for employment in the labor market and to proceed with continuous medical education that makes the program attractive. Since 2015, due to the efforts made by Tbilisi State Medical University and UniMan "Academy of International Management and Performance" (France) joint International Master's

Program in "Public Health Management and Health Policy" was developed and launched at TSMU Faculty of Public Health.

In 2013 the USMD Program, a joint project, which has been developed and implemented with the cooperation of the Tbilisi State Medical University (TSMU) and Emory University (Atlanta, U.S.) School of Medicine (ESOM) was established.

In 2015, according to the agreement signed between Tyrol Hospitals Union - the Western Education Centre (AZW), Georgian-Austrian Bachelor of Nursing Programme allowing TSMU nurses to be trained and gain international experience in the Clinics of Austria

Professors delivered thematic lectures in different fields of medicine and provided following activities: consultations and charity operations at TSMU University clinics.

It should be emphasized that in 2019 the International Networking Center (in Georgia) of International Association for Medical Education (AMEE) was founded at Tbilisi State Medical University (TSMU). This is a third center in the World. It is one of the most important events on the way to integration to European Higher Education Area and the second opportunity for Georgia to become a Regional International Hub in Medical Education.

## Welcome and congratulations on your acceptance to the American MD program of TSMU

Tbilisi State Medical University has always been a pioneer of innovation and success. American MD Program, established in collaboration with Emory University School of Medicine was launched in 2013-2014 academic year under the department of medicine at Tbilisi State Medical University (TSMU).

Based on Emory University School of Medicine Curriculum, entire education process of American MD Program is conducted in English. Emory University professors along with their colleagues from TSMU are actively involved in planning, implementation and quality management of the United States medical education model in Georgia.

Drs. Gordon Churchward, Mary Jo Lechowicz, Joel Felner and many others regularly visit TSMU and conduct lectures and grand rounds for students and faculty of the American MD Program, as well as work on faculty development and program monitoring. Faculty and administration of the program from the TSMU also regularly visits Emory School of Medicine to observe methodology of American Medical Education on site. Such collaboration and exchange of the professors and personnel between two institutions makes implementation and execution of new methodologies smoother and more efficient.

As it is well known, American MD Program provides students with the opportunity to prepare and pass US Medical Licensing Examinations before graduation. It also offers opportunities to participate in clinical trainings at Emory in Atlanta,

covery phase opportunities with the world's leading research centres, such as Walter Reed Army Research Unit Georgia at the Lugar Laboratory in Tbilisi is one of the exciting highlights of the program.

Education Model of the American MD Program includes complete integration of basic, preclinical and clinical subjects. This type of education has many benefits: basic knowledge is enriched with clinical aspects and basic subjects are taught in combination with clinical disciplines which eases clinical correlation of different disciplines associated with individual organ systems. Significant feature of integrated curriculum is active demonstration of clinical cases (patient, simulated patient or clinical history), which helps students master clinical skills. The modern teaching methodologies of the program include but are not limited to problem solving, evidence based medicine, case presentation and participation in various interdisciplinary team work activities.

Along with the foundation subjects of medicine, significant accent is made on humanities, such as social-cultural and medical anthropology, history of civilization, history of art, philosophy, psychology, world literature, etc. Such curriculum enriches students' general education and assures successful communication skills with the future patients, colleagues and society in general.

Course called 'Becoming a Doctor' starts in the beginning of the first semester and follows the curriculum throughout 6 years. Aiming at development of basic clinical and behavioural skills, such as bedside manners, history taking, clinical examination, etc. 'Becoming a Doctor' Course prepares students for medical profession.

The working group 'Curriculum Committee', which includes professors as well as students of the American MD Program, is changed with identification, discussion and solution of the strengths, challenges, and opportunities as well as students and faculty affairs and is a firsthand gatekeeper for the quality of the program.

Summer at Emory` and `Winter at Emory` - 3 week certificate program at Emory university is a course specially designed for the students of the American MD Program. The Course introduces participants to US Medical education, Health care System and Medical services. Highlight of this program is an opportunity to experience clinical activities at the bedside of the patient with the peer students and residents from Emory University School of Medicine.

Every year nearly 40 students of American MD Program attend 'Summer at Emory' and 'Winter at Emory' Programs in Atlanta, Georgia, USA. Program was first introduced in August 2013 and repeats twice a year since, thus, became a tradition for the second year students.

We are proud to inform you that on June 7th, 2019 we cel-

ebrated the first graduation ceremony of American MD Program Class of 2019 at Tbilisi State Medical University.
